His father was killed in the mass shooting at the Sikh Temple in Oakfield, Wisconsin, in August of 2012. In the wake of this attack, Kaleka has become a powerful voice against hate. He and his friend, former white supremacist Arno Michaelis, formed Serve2Unite so that, in Kaleka’s words, “children of all ethnicities, from the inner city to the suburbs, are coming together to cherish each other as human beings and to assume the identity of peacemakers in their schools and communities.” His book, *The Gift of Our Wounds* (co-written with Michaelis), will be available for purchase at the Banquet. His message of forgiveness and *Charhdi Kala* (a Sikh principle meaning “we move in relentless optimism”) could not be more crucial for today.

The ESTHER printed yearbook will be distributed at the Banquet, made available in ESTHER faith communities, and shared with community members and business leaders throughout the coming year. The digital version will be available on the ESTHER website for viewing or download. Your sponsorship is both an investment in the work of ESTHER and an opportunity to feature your business in the community.
